New Registration/ Moving house

You can choose which doctor or nurse you would like to see but you may have to wait longer for an appointment

Outer boundary

Post codes in our outer boundary are SE18,SE28,SE2,SE3,SE7,SE9,SE10, SE12 (Greenwich Borough) DA5,DA6,DA7,DA8, DA14, DA15, DA16,DA17,DA18

If you are currently registered with the practice and you move to house you can continue to be registered if you move to a new home with one of the above postcodes. You will become an out of area registration which will mean that you can attend the surgery to see the GP but will not be able to request home visits.
